Gasherbrum I, surveyed as K5 and also known as Hidden Peak, is the 11th-highest mountain in the world at 8,080m above sea level.

## REQUIRED EXPERIENCE:

Experience in mountaineering (6000 m. /7000 m. /8000 m.) is recommended and required to sign up for this expedition.

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## OVERVIEW:

Mt. Gasherbrum I is the 11th-highest peak in the world. It is located in the Gilgit Baltistan region of Pakistan. Gasherbrum I is a part of the Gasherbrum massive, located in the Karakoram region of the Himalayas. Gasherbrum is a remote group of high peaks in the Karakoram, located at the northeast end of the 36-mile Baltoro glacier. Mt.G-I is regarded as a bit more challenging than Mt. G-II. Mt. G-II (8035m/ 26362ft) is the 13th highest mountain in the world. G-I and G-II are the most remote 8,000m peaks.

The group forms a semi-circle around its own South Gasherbrum Glacier. A French Expedition led by H. De Segogne made the first attempt in 1936, but they could not climb beyond Camp V at a height of 6797 meters. However, in 1958 an American Expedition led by Nich Clinch made the first ascent of Gasherbrum I. Pete Schoening and Andy Kaufman were the first to reach the summit.

Gasherbrum I is the "least popular" of the 8000-meter peaks. It is also one of the peaks with the least deaths, but this probably has to do with the fact that only really experienced mountaineers try a peak as difficult as Gasherbrum I. The peak was also the venue of the world's first 8,000-meter climb in pure Alpine Style. This means that the start of the climb is done from the bottom of the mountain and all gears are carried on the way, if any bivouacs, they will be found on the way. The most common way to climb the peak is to attack the western side and all routes here lead to "The Japanese Couloir", which is located on top of the north-west face. The first ascent (1958) was made via Spur Peak and then via the long southeast ridge to the summit.

10. **DUFFLE BAG:** One Seven Summit Treks' Duffle Bag.

**TRANSPORTATION:** All necessary expedition equipment transportation for all Members and Staff from Nepal to Pakistan (by air cargo) – Islamabad to Askole (by truck/jeep) and Base camp (by Porters/mules) – While returning: Base camp to Askole (by porters/mules) and Askole to Islamabad (by Truck/jeep). Based on the condition, different transportation variants may adopt.
13. **MEMBER LUGGAGE:** Up to 60 Kg per member for personal baggage during the trek to be carried by porters or Mules.
14. **FOOD AND LODGING:** 3 meals a day (breakfast, lunch, and dinner; including tea and coffee) along with accessible accommodation at Hotel/Lodge/TENT during the trek and at the Basecamp. Hygienic vegetables, meat, fruits, soft drinks, and juice will be served during the entire expedition. Well-managed base camp set up for members & Staff.
15. **CAMPING:** All necessary logistic arrangements for Camping during the trek.
16. **PORTER:** Porters per member up to the basecamp and from the basecamp (both ways).
17. **BASE CAMP STAFF:** Experienced and well-trained Base Camp Cook & kitchen Helpers as required.
18. **BASE CAMP COOK:** 1 Nepalese and 1 Pakistani well-trained cook for the team.
19. **STAFF SALARY AND ALLOWANCE:** All Nepalese staff & porter's daily wages, salary, equipment, food & clothing.

24. **TRAINING:** Oxygen, Mask Regulator, Ice wall, and Ladder training at basecamp by UIAGM Guide.
25. **HIGH ALTITUDE CLIMBING SHERPA:** 1 veteran and government-licensed climbing Sherpa per member (1 Member: 1 Sherpa), during the entire climb from Basecamp to the summit and back, and on each rotation.
26. **ASSISTANCE:** Climbing Sherpa to assist in carrying your gear to the high camps.
27. **CLIMBING SHERPA SALARY & ALLOWANCE:** Climbing Sherpa Salary, Equipment, Food, and Clothing.
28. **OXYGEN BOTTLE (O2):** Summit Oxygen cylinder: 3 oxygen bottles (4 liters) for each member and 2 oxygen bottles for each high-altitude Sherpa. \*\*
29. **OXYGEN MASK & REGULATOR:** 1 Set of Summit Oxygen masks & regulator for each member and high-altitude Sherpa. \*\*
30. **BACK UP OXYGEN:** Back up Oxygen Cylinder, mask, and regulator (SUBJECT TO A CHARGE).
31. **HIGH CAMP SERVICE (INFRASTRUCTURE AND LOGISTICS):** High Altitude Tent, Necessary cooking EPI gas, cooking pot, High food for a member, Sherpa, and other crews at (C1) (C2), and (C3). Group climbing gears, fixed and dynamic rope during the climbing period as required.
32. **HIGH ALTITUDE TENT:** Members will share tents in high camps (2 members: 1 tent).
33. **ROPE FIXING TEAM:** The team of experienced Sherpas (including personal Sherpa) will fix the route to the summit of G 1 (no extra charge will be applied to members).
34. **SATELLITE PHONE:** Satellite Phone for emergency communication carried by Sherpa, also available for members (SUBJECT TO A CHARGE).
35. **WALKIE-TALKIE:** Walkie-Talkie for communicating from Base Camp to Mountain and Mountain to Base Camp.
36. **PERMITS:** Satellite Phone/walkie-talkie permit for all members and staff.
37. **WEATHER FORECAST:** Weather forecast report regularly from Meteotest, Bern (Switzerland) during the entire expedition.
38. **MEDICAL KIT:** Comprehensive Medical kit for members and staff.
39. **CERTIFICATE:** G-1 climbing certificate issued by PAKISTANI ALPINE CLUB (after climbing Mt. G 1 successfully).

## COST EXCLUDES:

1. **AIR FARE:** International flight airfare (from and to Islamabad).
2. **PAKISTAN ENTRY VISA FEE:** PAKISTANI Visa fee for 90 DAYS.
3. **LUNCH & DINNER:** Lunch & dinner during the stay in Islamabad and Skardu (also in case of early return from Trekking / Expedition than the scheduled itinerary).
4. **EXTRA NIGHTS IN ISLAMABAD & SKARDU:** Extra nights' accommodation in Islamabad & Skardu. In case of early arrival or late departure, early return from Trekking / Expedition, or domestic flight cancellation (due to any other reason) than the scheduled itinerary.
5. **INSURANCE POLICY:** Insurance covering both medical and high-altitude evacuation costs (for the trip cancellation, interruption, high-altitude rescue & air evacuation, medical treatment, repatriation, etc.) \*Mandatory

## INSURANCE:

There is a fine line between adventure and blatant risk. Mountaineering is an adventure trip that carries an intrinsic danger and the nature of travel implies things don't generally go according to the plan, which is the reason why we require every one of our clients to get acceptable and proper insurance.

Due to unanticipated reasons, for example, injury, family issues, work commitments, etc., clients may need to cancel their trip before the start or during the expedition. Considering these factors, it's better to be prepared for the possibilities.

As mentioned in the Terms and Conditions of Seven Summit Treks, the agency is exempt from being liable for different expenses that may occur in case of different emergencies or unforeseen situations. In addition to that, a foreigner isn't allowed to purchase insurance on Nepali soil. Both facts point out the

requirement of a client to purchase an elaborate travel insurance plan in their place of origin that protects their interest in case of trip cancellation, helicopter evacuation, medical emergencies, other illnesses, lost luggage, theft, disasters, death, and so on.

You are free to pick your insurer however look for an arrangement that covers trip postponement and cancellation, rescue, and covers medical as well. Guarantee it doesn't have limitations on the height you will climb, prohibitions on the exercises you are embracing, or the places you will be visiting. Protect yourself with the right insurance so you can go on your expedition with peace of mind and focus more on your climbing.

Please make sure to send us a copy of your insurance policy before you start your expedition so that we can assist you in any case of an emergency.

Note: In Pakistan, you have to pay in advance for any kind of rescue Heli flight which is only done by the Pakistan Army, that means you have to pay around USD 24,000 - USD 26,000 for any case beforehand for the flight and you will get a refund if you pay any extra cost. Depending upon the weather, and documentation the rescue process may take up to 2-3 days, but we will make sure that we get the process done as early as possible. So, while purchasing an insurance policy you must see the feasibility of covering rescue and medical for the purpose of trekking and mountaineering activities in Pakistan.

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## BOOKING & PAYMENT PROCESS:

If you intend to embark on an adventure through Seven Summit Treks, you must book a trip 3 and a half months before the trip. Client must submit their name and details of their purpose of visit to the Pakistan government. After review, the government will approve the name for the visa application. This process doesn't cost any charges. A client must confirm a booking at least 2 months before the trip, to secure the booking for the expedition or trekking of their interest.

A client must disburse 30% of the total cost, 2 months before the start of the trip. The advance amount will be used for the necessary booking of hotels, flights, guides, and porters and for receiving approval from governmental authorities. Another 40% of the total charge should be deposited a month before the flight to Pakistan. The remaining 30% of the total charge should be paid up after you arrive in Pakistan, before the start of your adventure.
